

BJP for adequate Central forces for Sabang by-poll

THE West Bengal BJP unit today accused the ruling TMC of "letting loose a reign of terror" and demanded adequate deployment of Central paramilitary forces for the Sabang assembly by-poll, which is scheduled to be held on December 21.

The BJP today organised a sit-in demonstration outside the office of

Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of West Bengal and demanded deployment of adequate Central forces to ensure free and fair elections.

"According to the norms of election commission of India, we want Central paramilitary forces to be deployed in all the booths of Sabang constituency. Democracy is under threat and TMC has let loose a reign of terror. It is the duty of the election commission to ensure that free and fair



voting takes place," BJP leader Mukul Roy said.

Earlier this week a BJP delegation had met the CEO and submitted a deputation in this regard. The CEO of West Bengal had already sent

eight companies of Central forces to Sabang. But the BJP wants 14 companies of Central forces to be deployed in Sabang.

The TMC leadership while reacting to BJP's demand said, "they can ask for as many force they want to."

They had tried the same trick in 2016 but had failed.

The people of West Bengal stands with Mamata Banerjee, we will win the seat with a much bigger margin".

CPI(M) plans campaign about 'divisive politics of BJP-RSS'

THE CPI(M) has decided to launch a campaign in West Bengal to raise awareness about the dangers of the alleged divisive politics of the BJP-RSS in Left-ruled Tripura, where Assembly elections are due next year.

"The RSS-BJP and other divisive forces are trying to polarize the atmosphere of Tripura by pursuing the politics of religion, caste and creed. We need to play a constructive role against



such politics," CPI(M) state secretary and politburo member Surya Kanta Mishra said.

According to a CPI(M) leader, the party's West Bengal unit will organize a seminar here on December 28 where Tripura Chief Minister Manik Sarkar has been invited as the main

speaker. The party will also organize other programmes to inform the people about the situation in Tripura.

A CPI(M) state committee member said, the people should know how the BJP and RSS were allegedly trying to divide the society on communal lines.

Mocking the CPI(M) for trying to find an excuse as it will lose the next Assembly polls, a member of the West Bengal BJP unit said, "the people of Tripura are fed up with the misrule of the CPI(M)."

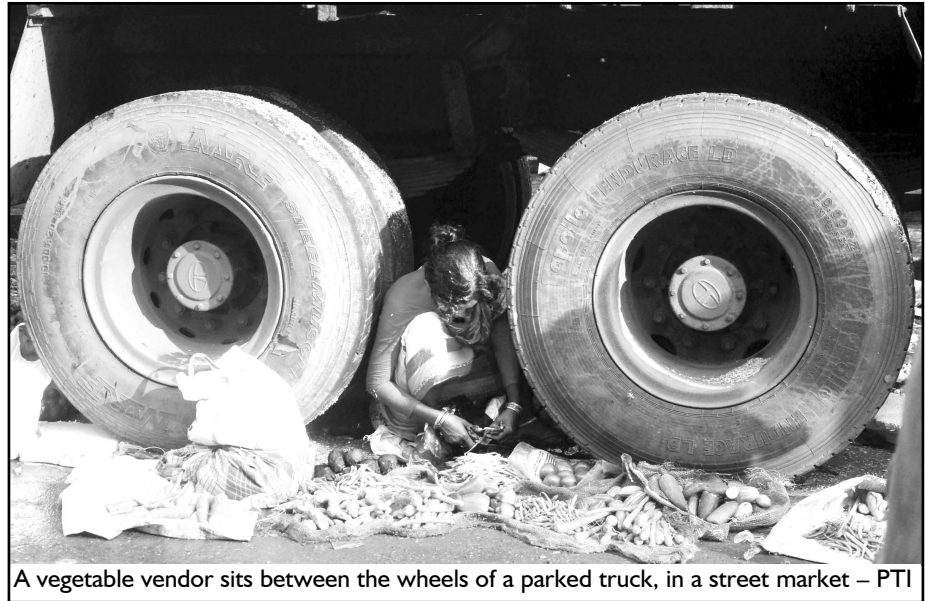
The Institute has recently organized campus placement drive in four regions for month of October - November consecutively at Chennai, Delhi, Kolkata and Mumbai.

CM Mamata remembers Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel

CHIEF Minister Mamata Banerjee today remembered the country's first home minister Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on his death anniversary.

"Solemnly remembering the Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on his death anniversary," Banerjee said in a tweet. Patel, who was also the first deputy prime minister of India, died on December 15, 1950 - three years after Independence - at the age of 75.

Known as the "Iron Man" of India, Patel was instrumental in uniting the country through the merger of small princely states.



Historic Town Hall building to become earthquake-proof

THE West Bengal government has decided to strengthen the Tuscan pillars of the historic Town Hall building here and make it earthquake-proof, officials said.

This will be a part of the building's restoration project, they said.

The decision of strengthening the 204-year-old building was taken, on the basis of the advice given by experts from IIT Roorkee, since the city witnessed a series of mild tremors in the last couple of years, a senior official at the Public Works Department (PWD) said.

"There has been a series of mild earthquakes in the city in the past few years. Experts from IIT Roorkee have prepared a detailed report for restoring the structure, and the decision for earthquake-proofing is based on it," the official said.

The PWD would put fibre-reinforced concrete around the giant six Tuscan pillars, as a part of

the strengthening process, as advised by the IIT experts.

"We will be using steel to fix the roof with pillars to ensure that the building is strong enough to withstand an earthquake," he said.

KMC will complete the process within 18 months. The civic authority has dismantled the museum, Kolkata Panorama in the Town Hall.

Popularly known as India's first hi-tech storytelling museum, it used to depict the evolution of the city.

There is a plan to change the entire lighting of the building also, the officer said.

The Town Hall, designed by architect-engineer Major General John Garstin, was paid for by public lottery.

There were problems of flooding and subsidence in the building even after its inauguration in the early 19th century.

In 1867, the Town Hall came under the custody of the Calcutta Municipality, now known as the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

QNet, KENT join hands

The alarming statistics revealed in the survey report is also reflective of the state of safe drinking water availability in the entire country. A whopping 80% of India's surface water is polluted, a recent assessment by WaterAid in 2016, an international organisation working for water sanitation and hygiene has shown.

Bangladesh wants India to raise Rohingya issue in UN

BANGLADESH wants Myanmar to take back the Rohingya refugees and it expects India to move a resolution in the United Nations for the same, Bangladesh minister Mosharraf Hossain said today.

It is not sustainable for a poor country like Bangladesh to carry on feeding the huge number of Rohingya refugees from Myanmar for a very long time, he said.

"We would like India to move a resolution in the United Nations to call on Myanmar to take back the Rohingyas from Bangladesh as we cannot keep them lifelong with our limited resources," the Bangladesh minister for Housing and Public Works

said. Hossain said it was due to humanitarian reasons that Bangladesh decided to give shelter to the Rohingyas.

"Had we pushed them back, they would have been killed," he said.

An estimated 6,20,000 Rohingyas have entered Bangladesh following an Army crackdown on rebels in Myanmar.

At least 6,700 Rohingya Muslims, including at least 730 children under the age of five, were killed in the first month of a crackdown that started in August in Myanmar's northern Rakhine state, according to an estimate released by Doctors Without Borders.

An international humanitarian NGO, Doctors Without Borders is best known for its work in war-torn regions and developing countries

affected by endemic diseases.

Asked about terrorist outfits using Bangladesh soil for nefarious activities, the minister said, "We have a zero-tolerance policy towards terrorism."

Bangladesh acts very strongly against any terrorist act on its soil, he said.

The minister is leading a 72-member delegation from his country to celebrate India's victory over Pakistan in the 1971 war and the subsequent liberation of Bangladesh on December 16.

A Mukti Joddha (freedom fighter), Hossain actively participated in the Liberation War for his country and had blown up a crucial bridge during the 1971 conflict, affecting supplies to the Pakistan Army in the eastern theatre, a defence official said.

70 lakh high school students given free bicycles: CM

SEVENTY lakh high school students in state-run schools of West Bengal have been given bicycles free of cost under 'Sabuj Sathi' scheme, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said today.

"We launched Sabuj Sathi scheme on this day in 2015. We have empowered 70 lakh school students (Classes IX-XII) by providing them free bicycles," she wrote on her Twitter handle this morning.

'Sabuj Sathi' means students' companion. 'Sabuj', the Bengali word for 'green' also implies 'children' while 'sathi' means 'companion'.

"Those who live in remote areas can easily go to school now. We are committed to Maa, Mati, Manush," she added.

3-day film fest to create environmental

THE third edition of Kolkata International Wildlife Environment Film Festival began today with more than 300 schoolchildren taking an oath to protect nature and wildlife.

Noted environmentalists and Magsaysay awardees Prakash Bha

Amte and Mandakini Amte, who were present at the inaugural function of the three-day fest at Gorky Sadan, joined the children as they promised to preserve and enhance the glory of nature.

Later in the day, Jungle Book Bear, a film by Oliver Goetzl, was also screened at the centre.

The three-day extravaganza, organised by NGO

Desham, aims to sensitise people about the need to conserve the environment, a festival coordinator said.

Lauding the initiative, Mandakini Amte said, "I think more such film festivals should be arranged across the country to generate interest and awareness on environmental matters among the younger generation."

A special show of

Marathi feature film 'Dr Prakash Baba Amte - The Real Hero', based on the life and works of the Amte couple, was also organised at Rotary Sadan as part of the inaugural function today.

Altogether, 66 films from 116 countries, including India, have been selected for screening at five auditoriums in the city, festival director Aditya Mukherjee said.

Police to host football tournaments to improve ties in Darjeeling

THE West Bengal police will be organizing fortnight-long football tournaments in Darjeeling district to rebuild police-public ties which had been affected during the 104-day long shutdown in the hills. It will begin from the local police station level this week.

"We want to have good relationship with the locals. There should be trust and mutual respect. We hope that this football tournament helps us to rebuild our relationship," a senior police official said.

"We are organizing football tournament in the entire Darjeeling district. This tournament will help us to improve our relationship with the masses," Inspector General of Police, Darjeeling range, Manoj Verma said.

The police is also ensuring that only local players of these areas participate in the tournament so that "teams do not get unfair advantage by hiring players from outside Darjeeling".

The first prize at the local, sub-divisional and the district levels will be Rs 10,000,

Rs 20,000 and Rs 1,50,000 respectively.

The tournament will begin from Tukvar-Goke, Badamtam-Lebong, Pandam-Phubtshearing and Pulbazar-Bijanbari, areas in Darjeeling which still have a support base of GJM supremo Bimal Gurung.

"We are receiving a huge response. Nearly 40 teams are participating from these four areas. There are several other teams in the entire district," said a police official.

Gurung is on the run since August last, after cases under UAPA were lodged against him in connection

with the bomb blasts in the hills. Gurung's home at Patlebas falls under Tukvar area.

In the football tournament spread over the four areas, the winning team will get a cash prize of Rs 1.5 lakh while the runner-up will get Rs 1 lakh.

The idea of organizing the event was taken from the past experience of the police in organizing similar tournaments in Janglemahal area - comprising forested areas of West Midnapore, Bankura and Purulia districts - once synonymous with Maoist violence.
