Hyderabad, Feb 1 (PTI) Faced with criticism over the government issuing several ordinances, Union Minister M Venkaiah Naidu today said the government has "no fancy for issuing ordinances" and that the Opposition should allow the Parliament to function properly.

"Nobody has got a fancy for issuing ordinances. We don't want to issue ordinances. But a violent minority cannot obstruct a silent majority from taking the country's development forward," the Parliamentary Affairs Minister said.
