Guidelines from the Directorate of Studies to Directorate of Examination for the examinations under Syllabus 2022

General guidelines:

- a) Questions must be given in such a way that an average student, who is reasonably prepared, should obtain Minimum Pass marks. Questions should be set within the syllabus only and based on the study notes provided by the Institute.
- b) At all the level of exams, few questions must be set in such a way, to test the knowledge of the student on the fundamentals of the subject.
- c) The questions must not be too much lengthy. The size of the question and expected workings to derive the answer must be commensurate with the marks.

A student who is reasonably prepared, must be in a position to answer at least 80%-90% of the questions within the stipulated time of Examination for each subjects.

Foundation Course:

Each subject is for 100 Marks consisting of 50 multiple choice questions (each question will carry 2 marks) and 1 Hour exam for each subject is to be conducted in an offline mode.

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40% of Questions may be set at basic level based on the fundamental concepts only (Formula based problems in case of Mathematics and Statistics Papers). No case laws should be asked in Law Paper.

Keeping in view of the maturity level of the Foundation students i.e. +2 level (different streams and different states having different syllabi at +2 level), paper must be set in such a way that considerable no. of students must be in a position to answer the paper.
